**Dental Complete Oral Health and Treatment Assessment:**

Your pet's doctor has recommended a complete dental prophylaxis treatment for your pet which **is performed under general anesthesia**. Following your doctor's evaluation, we will perform the following:

\*Complete physical examination prior to anesthesia

\*Hand Scaling

\*Ultrasonic Scaling

\*Post-Op Exam of Mouth

\*Polishing of all teeth

\*Complete Oral Exam and Charting

The cost of the above services is \$110-\$145 plus an additional \$45(+) for anesthesia. Your pet may also go home on oral antibiotics. The cost ranges from \$18-\$45 depending on the type and your pet's weight.

**Preanesthetic Bloodwork:**

If your pet **is over six (6) years of age or the doctor has other concerns**, pre-anesthetic blood test may be required. The typical test performed in this situation is a Chemical Profile which measures your pet's vital organ enzymes, such as liver and kidneys, before anesthetizing.

**OralVet Barrier Sealant and At Home Dental Chews:**

After cleaning and polishing we recommend applying OraVet. It is a barrier sealant that creates an invisible barrier preventing plaque and bacteria from attaching to your pet's teeth. It is non-toxic and can be used in pets of any age. Once the sealant is applied, we recommend using the Oral Vet Chews once daily at home 2 weeks after the dental for optimal dental health.

**Dental Radiography:**

A full set of dental radiographs is the current standard of care, although optional. Many times radiographs detect hidden causes of gum disease that cannot be seen. Unless your doctor has consulted otherwise, the doctor may find in necessary to take dental x-rays of your pet's mouth. In an effort to **limit anesthesia time for your pet**, we request pre-authorization to provide this service if the doctor believes to be in the best interest of your pet.

**Dental Extractions and Treatments:**

**Treatment of oral disease (if needed) may include oral surgery for extractions of the teeth, gum surgery, and/or antibiotic gum treatment.** Please review the following options and initial your final selection.

**PLEASE NOTE:** There are rare and potential complications of oral surgery. These include but are not limited to bleeding, jaw fractures, retained tooth roots, nose bleeds, injury and healing complications at the surgical sites. We take every precaution to minimize these complications by using proper surgical technique, instrumentation, and dental radiographs.

**\*\*** In some severe cases, we may need to stage a pet’s treatments into 2 or 3 separate procedures. This may be due to the length of treatment required, concerns of anesthesia time, or severity of gum disease. The later stages are usually completed within 3 – 12 weeks, depending on what your doctor recommends.

**PetLink Microchip Placement:**

While your pet is under anesthesia we can place a microchip. In the event you pet becomes lost, a microchip can make is easier to locate and reunite you and your pet. Additionally, a microchip is usually required for many types of pet transport to identify your pet.
